N.B.

The declaration in lieu of certification and the declaration in lieu of deed of notoriety referred to in Articles 46 and 47 of Italian Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28 December 2000 may only be used by Italian and European Union citizens and by legal entities (companies, associations, etc.) with a registered office in Italy or in another European Union country.

Citizens of non-EU states may use the aforementioned declarations in lieu to declare states, personal qualities and facts that can be certified or declared by Italian public bodies and only if they are legally residing in Italy.

Declarations in lieu must be signed directly by the declaring party and no form of representation/power of attorney conferred on third parties is permitted when it comes to issuing the declaration.

In terms of occupational safety, declarations must be signed by the actual legal representative of the contractor company and not just by the employer, if these are different people.
